This week I hope we will put aside time to give God thanks for the many blessings we have received from Him and from others. (Hopefully our thanksgiving lasts more than on Thanksgiving Day!) I think it is also appropriate for such thanks as we celebrate the great Feast of Christ the King this weekend while getting ready for Advent which begins next Sunday.

I thank God for you and the gift of faith He has given to each one of us. Our faith is such a tremendous resource when we are

faced with challenges, difficulties, and doubts. We are in difficult times and maybe our Covid fatigue takes us down a path thinking God has left us. Let us never forget, in good times or in challenging times, that God is great and wonderful and never leaves us!

Thanks for the ways in which you pray for the parish. Thanks for the times you allow your faith to be challenged and try to see beyond the limitations we impose on ourselves. The thanks we express to God, and to each other, remind us of how we are so connected to each other. While we don't have many (only 16) young people willing to be altar servers, they will return for some of the weekend Masses. In addition, we will resume the practice of people bringing up the gifts at the preparation of the altar (offertory).
- ** Thanks be to God for those who have stepped up to be members of our Prayer Ministry Team! Beginning next Sunday, they will be available after Saturday Vigil/Sunday Masses around the tabernacle to receive your prayer intentions and pray with or for you. Thank you ministers!!



Stewardship Thoughts

Today's Scripture passages rightly profess Christ as King. In the Second Book of Samuel, David is anointed Israel's king. Christ will descend from the Davidic line. In St. Paul's Letter to the Colossian community, he states: *He delivered us from the power of darkness and transferred us to the kingdom of His beloved Son.* In St. Luke's Gospel account of Christ's Passion, the evangelist shows Jesus' power and compassion — His kingship — to forgive the good thief on the cross. Christ promises him: *today you will be with me in Paradise*. As faithful disciples and stewards of His abundant grace, we stand in admiration of our King, our Lord, and our Savior. He gives us life and the hope of eternal happiness and joy. At the celebration of the Mass, we express reverence to Christ in a special way through our approach to receiving Holy Communion. Do we receive our Lord and Savior in a respectful manner, acknowledging His true presence in the Eucharist: Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity?



Living Under the Influence

It's so good to be back at Star!

I was here between 2010-2017 in the role of Director of Faith Formation and later Director of Evangelization. Since June of this year, I've been playing a small part-time role supporting Msgr. Gary in his desire that everyone truly know Jesus personally, to be set free of fear that would lead us away from Jesus and the Church, and to bring us all into greater communion and unity as a faith community. Star is unique, and a beautiful gift in which we can find Christ in each other, worship him with reverence, and a place we can confidently send our children to be formed in the faith properly expressed by the Catholic Church. Star is worth fighting for! A gift we can lose if we don't care for her. This is a work that requires everyone – no one priest, or staff or whatever, makes a parish. It is all of us, finding our place, vocation and gifts, and working together.

Coming back feels like coming home and that's because Star is filled with so many truly wonderful and faithful people. I hope you too feel the stirring that more is happening here. Perhaps a stirring for more within yourself and family. Jesus' deepest desire was that "they may all be one; even as you, Father, are in me, and I in you, that they also may be in us, so that the world may believe that you have sent me" (Jn 17:21). Jesus prayed this in his last hours before his crucifixion when all hope seemed to be lost, when it was most dark. But that is when God does his greatest work! There is always hope, always victory, because we have the resurrection, and are a people born through the waters of resurrection. I say we hold fast to this truth, form greater unity in Christ and let all see our hope that others may believe and come to know freedom.

Advent

One way to unite is to reclaim the beauty of our traditions and our identity in Christ. Advent approaches and this would be the perfect time to reclaim some of community, joy and whatever else the pressures of secular culture can take from us. Msgr. is planning an Advent Family Night (December 6) for every person at Star to come, be together and to encourage each other around Our Holy Mother and consider traditions and family. I'll say more as the weeks progress. Keep an eye out for more details!




