MARRIAGE

Archdiocesan law requires advance notice of at least six months.

Adults over 21 need to be registered as an individual member to be considered a Catholic in Good Standing.

Half and Half from Msgr. Gary Smetanka



Ready or not, Ash Wednesday is this week! So, we begin to think of the things to “do for Lent.” Often it is the normal, i.e., “giving up stuff” like giving up sweets, alcohol, candy, etc. This is great when it continues past the 40 days of Lent and effects some change of life or lifestyle. However, I have known very few people who have continued their Lenten practice of “giving up something” for many years after!

Lent should be viewed as a more intense spiritual time for us. With that in mind, hopefully what we do during Lent should have an overflow effect for the rest of our lives, helping us with our constant call to conversion. Hopefully, improving our spiritual life can have a greater and longer lasting effect on us than giving up something! Besides, the rewards are also greater!

Amongst the many things that you might be considering “doing for Lent,” please consider one item worth doing. If in the past year, or three, you have gotten “out of the habit” of participating in Sunday Mass every Sunday, this would be an opportune time to return to Mass every Sunday. The celebration of the Eucharist is central to who we are and what we believe. It is the primary place we encounter God, living and present in His Word proclaimed and in the Sacrament of His Body and Blood. I know of many people who are seeking the Lord but in all the wrong places! At Mass, each and every time, who come to experience how much God loves us, his beloved daughters and sons. He assists us in our daily and weekly struggles that we bring to Him and place on the altar. We receive, in return, His very life! It is life-changing! Anytime is a good time but Lent is a perfect time to return to the Lord as He calls us to Himself!

How about also spending some time in quiet prayer before the Lord? You can be amazed what can happen! There are plenty of opportunities to do this as you enter a church and simply spend the time praying before the Tabernacle, a cross or some other devotional statue. Stop by sometime! Before you tell the Lord all the things that are wrong or all the needs and petitions you have, thank Him for all the graces and blessings you have received. Praise, thank and adore the Lord for who He is and what He has done. Then stop and listen. Take the time to hear what He is saying to you! Allow the Lord to console you and uplift you. Allow the Lord to forgive you and heal you. Let the Lord guide you and bless you as you place your life in His hands as you spend an hour with Him. Think you can't spare the time? You will be amazed on how giving the Lord ten or twenty minutes will ease your other “time crunches.”

**** Ashes will be distributed *after the homily* at the 7:30 am Mass, 10:00 am Mass, and 7:00 p.m. Mass on Ash Wednesday. (There are also two Liturgy of the Word services on Wednesday.) So please be present at *the start* of the Mass, or service, to receive ashes. Just as a point of reminder and clarification, ashes *will not* be available during the day.**

**** A reminder that *Ash Wednesday* is a *day of fast and abstinence*. *Fasting* binds those from their 18th to their 60th year, allowing one full meal a day, with two lesser meals. The drinking of ordinary liquids does not break the fast. **Fridays of Lent are also days of abstinence:** abstaining from meat for ages 14 and up.**


