How is your journey this lent? Have you felt like you have been on a spiritual journey? Do you feel like you never started the journey? Been a bit bumpy? You don't know where the time has flown and now you realize Holy Week begins next Sunday and you kind of flubbed lent because of all the other distractions of life?

Well Lent is not over yet and there is always time to get back on track, to return to the Lord, to ask the Lord for help by letting Him know you are waking up a bit late. There is always time! Remember the Gospel accounts from the past two Sundays. The woman at the well: how we come searching and thirsty for Jesus at the well and he lets us leave with a renewed lease on life. The man born blind: how he lets Jesus use him as an instrument so the glory of God might shine forth, restoring him to wholeness. This Sunday we hear about the raising of Lazarus from the dead and the words of Jesus: "Untie him and let him go." See what the Lord is willing to do as we encounter Him in our life? Of course, we have to go to Him, be wiling to meet Him, open our hearts, hear His word, and take the step to let him perform His saving power in our life! It is never too late!!

As we approach the start of Holy Week next Sunday, may we be drawn into the dying and rising of Jesus. Whenever we hear the Word of God proclaimed at Mass, we are reminded that God does not and will not forget us! That is his promise to each one of us. God places his law in us and writes it upon our hearts. The question is, what is our response?

I suggest we all spend some extra time this week reflecting on the lessons we have learned about our individual selves this past year, especially this season of Lent. What new insights do we have about our charity toward others, our care toward others, our care for ourself? How has my relationship with the Lord grown, or diminished, the past year? What is God asking me to today, now, at this time, at this point in my relationship with Him? If I have become weaker in my faith, what steps can I take to once again become stronger? How might I renew the practice of my religion through his Holy Week and through the Easter season? We still have these valuable days left in Lent to bring us back to the Lord, the one in whom we profess our life and hope for eternal life.

** One way to open the heart to the Lord is through confession or the Sacrament of Reconciliation. **Monday evening is the vicariate penance service at 7 pm** at St. Joan of Arc church. Hopefully ten priests will be present to hear confessions. I have added an additional time for **private confessions Tuesday evening** from 6:30 - 7:30 pm. Don't worry if you have not been in a while, I will help you through it! The "light is on for you" to lighten your load, leaved the baggage behind, and allow the Lord to bestow such generous mercy upon you!

** The special Lent Almsgiving envelope can be returned any time if you will not be participating in Mass Holy Thursday evening. Thanks for your generosity!

** Notice the schedule for the upcoming Sacred Triduum liturgies here at Star of the Sea. These are the most power and unique liturgies of the year in the Church.

** Believe it or not, this Friday will be our last Fish Fry! It has been an amazing year! We have been honored to serve so many dinners this year with patrons coming from far and wide. (If you have not come for dinner yet this season, please stop by or carry-out this Friday!) Your wonderful compliments have been uplifting. Our great team of volunteers make it all happen! As exhausting as it is for the core team, with the planning, shopping, cutting, mixing, and baking, we know the good produced by bringing the community together is priceless. Thank you for your support.



Stewardship Thoughts

The passage from St. John's Gospel retells Lazarus' dying, and Jesus raising him from the dead. This miracle foreshadows Jesus' own Resurrection and reveals His power and glory. Throughout her history, the Church has unwaveringly embraced the sanctity and preservation of all human life, adamantly stressing that life must be protected from conception to natural death. The passages from the prophet Ezekiel and St. Paul's Letter to the Romans remind us

that our lives are in the Spirit, not in the flesh. As faithful stewards, we know life is a God-given gift and we must strive to uphold Church teaching on its sanctity. This can be challenging given modern socie-ty's "culture of death," which embraces the destruction of life at every stage — from embryonic stem cell research and abortion to euthanasia. Witness life by participating in a prayer vigil outside an abortion mill.
