

An Update on our Steinway!

Many of you have noticed that our beautiful concert grand piano was removed from the church before Christmas. Our piano, which is a Steinway 9 foot Model D, is considered the premiere concert grand piano used by world class orchestras and pianists all over the globe is out for a much needed refurbishment. Before it arrived at Star, the piano was used in the Steinway Concert and Artists (C&A) program for the first 10 years of its life which meant that in addition to being played by some of the world's greatest pianists when they toured through Detroit, it was also constantly being moved and tuned almost daily for a decade. If you figure that an average grand piano gets tuned 3-4 times a year, a piano in the C&A program gets tuned about 300 times a year, which would be the equivalent to about 750 years worth of tunings for a typical piano. That amount of stress on the pins, strings, and pinblock ultimately wears the piano out where it will no longer hold its tune properly and it loses the "voice" of a concert grand piano. These photos show that the keys and all the action, along with the piano's frame, pinblock, pins and strings have all been removed and is ready to have the soundboard replaced before reassembly can begin. Piano refurbishment at this level can take many months as the work is very slow and tedious and I'm pleased to report that we have engaged the best in the industry to do this work for us.
