#### ANOINTING OF THE SICK/ MINISTRY TO THE SICK

The Church strongly encourages people to receive the Sacrament (Anointing) of the Sick at the early stages of serious sickness or before serious surgeries.

In emergency situations needing the prompt attention of a priest, please call the parish office.

Archdiocesan law requires advance notice of at least six months.

#### **PARISH REGISTRATION**

Newcomers to the parish may register in the Parish Office during regular office hours. Others, please notify the Parish Office of address changes.

Adults over 21 need to be registered as an individual member to be considered a Catholic in Good Standing.

Hearing devices are available for use during Mass. Please ask an usher for assistance.



Lent comes to an end this Thursday evening...and then the "Paschal Triduum" begins. Holy Thursday, Good Friday and Holy Saturday are different than all other days in the Church's year, e.g., funeral Masses are not permitted these days. The liturgies we celebrate are all different than the normal liturgies we experience. In essence, they are to be looked at as one complete liturgy though divided over three

days. Let's take a look at each one of them.

Holy Thursday: There is only one Mass on Holy Thursday and that is the "Evening Mass of the Lord's Supper." At this Mass we commemorate the institution of the Eucharist, the institution of the priesthood and Christ's commandment to love all our brothers and sisters. At this Mass, we also consecrate enough hosts for communion on Good Friday. Following communion, the Blessed Sacrament remains on the altar and then carried in procession to a place of reposition. For us, we process to The Pointe where the Blessed Sacrament will remain until 10 pm. All are invited to come and pray during that time.

Good Friday: The official liturgy of the Church this day is the "Celebration of the Passion of the Lord". Our liturgy, which consists of three parts, will begin at 1:30 when the ministers enter in silence and everyone kneels. The Liturgy of the Word consists of two readings and then the reading of the passion from John's gospel. After the homily, we have the General Intercessions, i.e., ten intercessions praying for the members of the Church as well as those who do not believe in God. The second part of this liturgy is the Veneration of the Cross. Here our focus is on a cross, not a crucifix, the instrument of our salvation. This year, those who come to venerate the cross will do so with a bow or a genuflection. Holy Communion follows. The Blessed Sacrament that was consecrated at the previous evening is then distributed. Following communion and a short prayer, all the ministers and people exit in silence.

Holy Saturday: (Remember there is no 4 pm Mass this day.) On this day the church is still stark and empty. The day and night is one of vigil for the Lord. The liturgy of the whole year is "The Easter Vigil." It begins after sunset and darkness sets (8:30 pm this year) and consists of four parts. The first part is the Service of Light. The church is totally dark and we begin is a simple introduction as a fire is lit and then blessed. The new Easter or Paschal Candle is prepared, lit and then carried in procession through the dark church as "Christ our Light" is proclaimed three times and the Easter Proclamation (Exsultet) is sung. Following is the Liturgy of the Word. Here a number of readings are proclaimed, the Gloria is once again sung as well as the Alleluia. Part three is the Liturgy of Baptism and one of the real highlights of the night. We bless new water, initiate any new members of the Church through baptism and confirmation, and then together we all renew our baptismal promises. The fourth part is the usual Liturgy of the Eucharist when we receive the great gift of Jesus himself in His Body and Blood. Then we finally conclude the Easter Vigil with the sign of the cross and dismissal, going forth to bring the Light of Christ to the world.

These are truly he most beautiful liturgies of the Church's year. Hopefully the above explanation gives you a clearer idea as to what will happen during those liturgies.

# Stewardship Thoughts

Today, in St. Mark's processional Gospel passage, the evangelist describes Jesus' glorious and triumphant entry into Jerusalem. Christ's travel on a colt signifies that He is a different leader, not a Roman conqueror or king, but a Messianic King. He is a humble, suffering servant Who, as portrayed in St. Mark's Passion account, will sacrifice His life for all seeking eternal salvation. The prophet Isaiah proclaims how the Lord God leads and strengthens all those in difficult situations. St. Paul proclaims how Christ humbly emptied Himself, becoming human and dying for our salvation so God could exalt Him — that at the name of Jesus every knee should bend ... and every tongue confess that Jesus Christ is Lord! Do we, as faithful stewards, acknowledge God's tremendous gift of His Son by opening our hearts to a personal relationship with Him? Following Palm Sunday Mass, prominently display your blessed palms in your home as a reminder throughout the year of Jesus' invitation to a life of peace and joy with Him.


