Must be a registered member, in good standing, of OLSOS.

Archdiocesan law requires advance notice of at least six months.

Adults over 21 need to be registered as an individual member to be considered a Catholic in Good Standing.

I hope all of you are enjoying these summer days. I know it has been hot and muggy and we have not had this type of summer for some time. Nonetheless, that is what summer is usually about in our area!

Many think of summer as an easier, more carefree time, especially at a parish. That is not the case around here, especially this year! You have seen all the

roofing material lined up at the far end of the parking lot. (It has been dubbed the Rectory Wall.) That project, replacing the gym roof and the middle school roof, was delayed a few weeks but will now be starting in earnest this week, praying for good weather. At the same time, thanks to the Mens' Club, the gym floor is getting a renewal. There is patching to some parts of the floor, then a total stripping of the floor, sanding, then repainting of the floor with a new center court logo, and finally a shiny new topcoat of (smelly) varnish! Thanks to the Auction "raise the paddle," new computers and technology will be installed in the computer/technology lab. We are also taking the opportunity to upgrade the whole technological infrastructure on campus, improving what we have but giving us a solid foundation for future technology. Three of the classrooms had the old carpeting removed and replaced with new hard surface flooring. (A surface easier to clean and sanitize!) Plus, there are a handful of other projects that create a very busy schedule around here.

Thanks for your support of the parish, our school, our auction, and all ministries. As we begin our 70th year of existence, we have a bright future ahead of us in our worship, our formation, our discipleship, and our service.

** This week we will not have our usual daily morning Mass at 7:30 am. I will be away this week and the beginning of next week for some rest and relaxation. I know the place is in great hands with our staff! Given the shortage of priests, and the close proximity of our neighboring parishes, it is beneficial to simply encourage our daily Mass faithful to go to a neighboring parish instead of imposing more Masses on other priests.







Stewardship Thoughts

Today's Scripture readings from the Book of the Prophet Ezekiel and the Gospel of St. Mark depict Jesus and Ezekiel as prophets rejected by their own people. St. Paul tells the Corinthian community, and us, that when he is weak, the Lord responds: My grace is sufficient for you, for power is made perfect in weakness. Paul concludes, ... for when I am weak, then I am strong. Today, the Catholic Church has prophetic voices proclaiming Her teachings on the sanctity of life, the sanctity and dignity of marriage, and on other important moral issues like assisted suicide or euthanasia. Through Revelation and Tradition, Jesus Himself inspires these Church teachings. As Christ's faithful disciples, let us open our hearts to listen to these modern-day prophets to understand the Church's moral teachings so we may counteract secular society's belief in moral relativism — "my morals are as good as your morals." The Catechism of the Catholic Church is a wealth of information on Catholic moral teaching.


