Here it is already the month of March. I bet many have looked forward to this day. The major portion of our cold winter is behind us. Spring training is in session and that is a sign warmer weather is around the corner. We see already "the days are longer" with more sunlight in the evening. March usually marks the time that Easter is around the corner...except for this year! We have a late Easter this year, April 20.

Why is Easter "late" this year? How is the date of Easter determined? (We have gone through this before but let's review for those who have forgotten.) Easter is the first Sunday after the first full moon of Spring. Spring begins March 20. The first full moon this year begins the evening of April 12 and ends the morning of April 13. The first Sunday after April 13 this year is April 20. So that is the date for Easter! (Easter will fall anytime between March 22 and April 25.). So we are not celebrating Easter in March this year, but that only means we are celebrating Ash Wednesday in March. In fact Ash Wednesday is this coming Wednesday!

We certainly know lent as a season of fasting. (See the front cover of this publication for the rules of fasting and abstinence during Lent.). We probably think lent less as a time of feasting. Maybe we can consider both this lent.

Yes, there are the two days in lent that we officially "fast," ie., Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. However, many people do other fasting as part of their lenten sacrifice. They might fast from pizza, chocolate, alcohol, desserts, pop, etc. Other fast from other activities in their daily life, e.g., social media, texting, computer games, television, etc. These are those things we do that we know we do too much of! The ultimate goal is, after Lent is over, some of our fasting continues because we have come to realize that we don't all that stuff anyway!

While it is good for us to fast during lent, we can feast as well. There are some solemnities or high feast days, e.g., the Annunciation of the Lord on Mach 25. Particularly on these days we are exempt from our fasting in order to truly celebrate the feast! If "feasting" is engaging in more, there is some feasting that can be good for us every day during Lent! Like feasting (spending more time) on prayer or daily Mass. We can feast on praying the Rosary everyday. We can feast by simply spending time with Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament, even just 15 minutes a day if we have never done that. We can feast by spending more time reading sacred scripture, performing works of charity, providing words of encouragement to others or acts of charity, etc. I think you get the point.

Very often people are asked or they say what they are giving up (fasting) for Lent,. Let's also ask ourselves how will we be feasting this lent? It is not just giving up but what can I do more of that will then become more of a habit in my life after Lent is over and we celebrate Easter and beyond? After all, if Lent is meant to rid ourselves of some of the bad stuff in our life, it is also a time to replace those things with good things that bring out the loving saint God created us to be!!
