Tuesday Archbishop Vigneron retires as the chief shepherd of the Archdiocese of Detroit. He is ending 16 years as Archbishop of Detroit.

Archbishop Vigneron is a "Detroit" priest. Raised in St. Clair County and attended his parish grade school, Immaculate Conception in Anchorville. He attended Sacred Heart Seminary high school and then on to Sacred Heart Seminary for college. He

continued his formation and education in Rome for his graduate studies, returning to Detroit and eventually being ordained a priest in 1975. His first priestly assignment was at Our Lady Queen of Peace in Harper Woods. It was at that time I first met him when I was in college seminary. Further academic studies resulted in a Doctor of Philosophy from the Catholic University of America. His priestly assignments include Academic Dean of the re-founded Sacred Heart Major Seminary, an official of the Vatican Secretariat of State, back to the SHMS as the second rector, also being ordained as an auxiliary bishop of Detroit in 1996. In 2003, he was named Bishop of Oakland, CA. It is very rare for a bishop to lead his hometown flock. But in January of 2009 the call came to become the 5th Archbishop of Detroit, returning home to lead the flock of SE Michigan.

Archbishop Vigneron's ministry in Detroit has been wide reaching. He inherited an archdiocese grappling with 23.9% unemployment and the worst economy since the great depression. One of his first tasks was to shore up the finance of the whole archdiocese through the "Changing Lives Together" initiative raising \$150 million. He would say the greatest instrumental moment during his time was Synod '16, resulting in the foundational pastoral letter, Unleash the Gospel, the bedrock principles still guiding us today in our mission outlook throughout the archdiocese. Certainly, the Beatification Mass of Fr. Solanus Casey was another moment of great significance during his time.

His work and ministry have been great over the years. Sharing and writing various pastoral letters and notes, serving on various boards, chairman of the board for the Catholic University of America, and key roles in the Unites States Conference of Catholic Bishops, including secretary and vice president. His influence and legacy within the Archdiocese will be long lasting!

As is required by Canon Law, he submitted his resignation on his 75th birthday Oct. 21, 2023. That letter was accepted by Pope Francis on February 11 of 2025, when the Holy Father appointed Archbishop-designate Edward Weisenburger as the 6th Archbishop of Detroit.

I have had the privilege of working alongside Archbishop Vigneron over the years. Together at Sacred Heart Major Seminary when he was Academic Dean, and as rector, as I was director of undergraduate seminarians. He appointed me as Chair of the Archdiocesan Worship Commission 15 years ago, which I still serve in that role, as an advisory council to the archbishop. He was instrumental in my appointment as a Chaplain to His Holiness with the title of monsignor. I have been an emcee for major diocesan liturgies, including his installation in Detroit 16 years ago, and I assist him at the funerals of priests. Very few people know this...but for the past 16 years, when emceeing these major liturgies at the Cathedral, as he descended the steps from the ambo following his homily, I was there to stealthily had him a glass of water!

I am very happy that he finally retires and will continue to serve in "simpler ways"!

He will be living at Sacred Heart Major Seminary where he is very much at home. He will teach some philosophy classes and continue to serve the church of Detroit in providing whatever help he can to Archbishop Weisenburger.

Please offer a few prayers for him this week in thanksgiving for all he has done serving God and the Church in Detroit and beyond. At the same time, pray for our new shepherd, Archbishop Edward Weisenburger as he begins his ministry here in Detroit. (The installation Mass will be livestreamed, more information at aod.org.)




