The past Tuesday we welcomed Archbishop Edward J. Weisenburger as the new Chief Shepherd of the Archdiocese of Detroit. He was installed as the 6th Archbishop of the Archdiocese of Detroit at the Cathedral of the Most Blessed Sacrament in Detroit. The cathedral was packed with 185 priests, 30 bishops, scores of family and friends of the Archbishop, and hundreds of faithful from Detroit, Tucson, Kansas, and beyond.

Weisenburger was born in Alton, Illinois, on Dec. 23, 1960, and grew up primarily in Lawton, Oklahoma. He graduated from Conception Seminary College in Missouri in 1983.

After receiving graduate degrees from the American College Seminary at the Catholic University of Louvain in Belgium, he was ordained to the priesthood in the Archdiocese of Oklahoma City, December 19, 1987. He also earned a canon law degree in 1992. Weisenburger served as pastor of Holy Trinity Catholic Church in Okarche, Oklahoma, from 1995-2002.

Okarche is a rural farming community, and Weisenburger would go out to a local farm for family dinners and parties. He would often play dominoes with various people in their houses. He also served as the rector of the Cathedral in Oklahoma City for ten years before being called and the ordained as the Bishop of Salina, Kansas on May 1, 2012. His leadership and ministry as the Bishop in Salina lasted only for 5 years when he was asked to go the Diocese of Tucson in Arizona. There he led the people of God for seven and a half years, having to declare bankruptcy for the diocese in 2004. He is described as a frugal man, listening to people, learning from the past and working hard for a brighter future.

His episcopal motto, that you read on his coat of arms, "Ecce Agnus Dei" tells you what is focus is..."Behold the Lamb of God." He wants all of us to see the Lamb of God, the one who sacrificed His life for us, and be drawn into his heart of love and mercy, Please offer your prayers this week for our new Archbishop, Edward Weisenburger.




