Archdiocesan law requires advance notice of at least six months.

Half and Half from Msgr. Gary Smetanka

I have to admit, this past Monday it was quite a shock to wake up and hear first that Pope Francis had died. I know he was very sick and spent more than a month in the hospital. There were reports back then that he was very critical and, later revealed, he was very close to death because of so many complications. Then he returns to the Vatican and is briefly seen during various events of the Triduum. Finally, on Easter Sunday here, it is there in St. Peter's square, even taking a lap around the crowd in the Popemobile. We knew he was frail and could not speak much, but he was there continuing his mission as our Holy Father, leading the Church.

Waking up to the news of his death was alarming and unexpected. Later in the day it was confirmed that he died of stroke and irreversible heart attack. His time of suffering was quickly brought to an end. He said many times, being Pope is for life, and he gave no indication of resigning given that he was still getting around and still active in his ministry to the world.

I will never forget watching the announcement, "Habemus Papem!" (We have a Pope!) and then seeing him come out on the balcony of St. Peter's. He just stood there. And he kept standing there. I don't recall him even smiling much. (Of course, if you were just thrust in that position, would you be smiling much??). I kept saying to the tv, "Do something! Smile! Wave!! Something!! Then he did. How powerful when he asked for everyone to pray for him, as he bowed down. Then he wished them a good evening and a good rest. His reactions that night certainly was not like his previous predecessors. Subsequently, we saw how charismatic he was around the babies, the youth, the elderly, everyone! He touched many hearts weather in St. Peter's Square or in his many pastoral visits around the world.

His taking the name of Francis was also very revealing what his papacy was going to be like. He was going to be like Francis of Assisi and care for all of God's creatures and all of God's creation and God's planet. He extraordinary care and outreach to the poor and oppressed will always be remembered. He was a simple man throughout his ministry. Living in a simple apartment as Archbishop of Buenos Ares, cooking his own meals and caring for another older Jesuit. Rode the city bus to get around. He would forgo the Papal apartment and continued to live in the Vatican guest house, where he was when he was elected Pope. His vestments were simple. He preferred to be driven around the very small simple autos. Wore the simple iron pectoral cross he was given when ordained a bishop. Simple yet profound in his direction and correction of the Church. As with every pope, he was loved by many and also disliked by many. Nonetheless, we thank the Holy Spirit for choosing him during the last conclave, just as the Holy Spirit has already chosen the next pope. As the cardinals were instructed by the papal preacher said at the start of the last conclave, as the next pope is already chosen by the Holy Spirit, they, the cardinals, just have to figure out who it is!

We thank God for the life and ministry of Pope Francis, the 266th successor to St. Peter. May God grant him eternal rest and peace.

should not wait until the final hours of one's life to receive this wonderful sacrament of healing. It is for the healing of the body and, most importantly, the soul. It gives people great peace when receiving the sacrament. This sacrament is meant to be received many times, i.e., at the beginning of an illness, various stages along the way, before serious surgeries, etc. There is also no distinction between this anointing of the sick and "last rites." I know some people wait until the final hours of one's life but that is risky in today's age because it can be difficult to get a priest to administer the sacrament given the shortage. (So please don't wait until the end!). We offer our prayerful support to all those who came forth to be anointed this weekend,

Let us pray for one another, pray for the repose of the soul of Pope Francis, and pray to the Holy Spirit preparing the hearts of the cardinal electors.

Stewardship Thoughts

Today's Scripture readings narrate the Apostles' actions after Christ's Resurrection. In the Acts of the Apostles, Peter shows compassion when he heals the sick, which results in a number of conversions to Christ. In the Book of Revelation, John, detained on the island of Patmos for his witness to Jesus, describes to Christ's followers his heavenly vision, encouraging them to keep the faith. In St. John's Gospel, the evangelist retells of Jesus' appearances after His Resurrection to the Apostles on consecutive Sundays. They are jubilant; Thomas indicates he now believes in Christ risen by proclaiming: My Lord and my God! Jesus breathes the Holy Spirit upon them and gives them the authority to forgive sins. Beginning with our Baptism, we, too, are called to discipleship in the Lord. As Christian stewards, we strive to express this discipleship through our sharing in prayer, service, and generosity with our parish and our brothers and sisters in need. Today, on Divine Mercy Sunday, learn to pray the Divine Mercy Chaplet on your rosary.


