ANOINTING OF THE SICK/ MINISTRY TO THE SICK

The Church strongly encourages people to receive the Sacrament (Anointing) of the Sick at the early stages of serious sickness or before serious surgeries.

In emergency situations needing the prompt attention of a priest, please call the parish office.

MARRIAGE

Must be a registered member, in good standing, of OLSOS. Archdiocesan law requires advance notice of at least six months.

PARISH REGISTRATION

Newcomers to the parish may register in the Parish Office or online at OLSOS.org. Please notify the Parish Office of address changes.

Adults over 21 need to be registered as an individual member to be considered a Catholic in Good Standing.

Hearing devices are available for use during Mass. Please ask an usher for assistance.



Well, what a time for the Church universal who has grieved the passing of our Holy Father Francis and then welcomed a new Holy Father, cheering as the steam of white smoke poured forth from the famous smokestack of the Sistine Chapel! (You are thinking that was more than a week ago, yes, but it has only been three days ago at the time of this writing in

preparation for a May 18 publication!) It has always been exciting to see white smoke, wait for the new Pontiff to be announced, and then emerge out on the balcony of St. Peter's Basilica. Classic moments etched into our memory and our history. Even more so with this past conclave and the Pope chosen.

I know I will never forget, still being exhausted Easter Monday morning, and jumping out of bed hearing the very early morning news that Pope Francis died. We knew he was very sick, but we just saw him on Easter Sunday!! God Bless Pope Francis for all he did leading the Church during his pontificate. Now, we shift in the time of mourning, praying for the repose of his soul, and praying for the Holy Spirit to inspire the cardinal electors and raise up a new shepherd for the Church.

Seeing white smoke so early in the conclave was the first surprise. I was expecting another day of voting. However, the quick conclave gave obvious quick consensus for the one selected, which is a good sign for the Church. Despite not one of the public "front runners," the cardinal electors were attentive to the prompting of the Holy Spirit to choose Cardinal Robert Prevost. Yes, American born, but served God's people around the world in his missionary work as an Augustinian priest, leader of the Augustinian Order, a bishop in the poorest dioceses in Peru, and head of the Vatican office for Bishops. A rather quick rise in ecclesiastical ranks as bishop, and a cardinal for only two years!

Now Pope Leo XIV needs our prayers. You know well the difficult task of leading 1.4 billion members of the Catholic Church who are in a wide range of life situations. He might be born in the USA, but he certainly has a world view of what is needed, well aware of the need to focus on human rights violations, numerous wars, internal Church conflicts, financial challenges within the Vatican, and so much more. As he told the College of Cardinals, together we walk and minister to all people to accomplish peace and unity.

Let us be open to what Pope Leo XIV says and teaches. Trust the Holy Spirit who has raised up, through the College of Cardinals, Robert Francis Cardinal Prevost, as Vicar of Christ here on earth. What he has to say is important for our good and the good of the Church!



MASS INTENTIONS

What does it mean to have a Mass "offered" for someone?

An individual may ask a priest to offer a Mass for several reasons: for example, in thanksgiving, for the intentions of another person (such as on a birthday), or, as is most common, for the repose of the soul of someone who has died.

It is worth noting, however, that the offering of the Mass for that intention does not depend on it being publicly voiced but on it being specified in the priest's personal prayers. Similarly, if a priest announces that "I am offering this Mass for [such and such an] intention" he does not thereby require the rest of the congregation to pray for that intention.

THE PRAYER FOR THE JUBILEE YEAR



In today's Gospel from the evangelist St. John. Jesus presents a new directive to His followers: Love one another. As I have loved vou, so vou also should love one another. Jesus further declares that everyone will know His disciples because of their love for one another. The Scripture passages from the Acts of the Apostles and Book of Revelation affirm God's presence in the lives of disciples who face trials for practicing their faith. Full discipleship in the Lord requires a total sacrificial love for others. In Unleash the Gospel. Archbishop Vigneron emphasizes: Growing as his disciples demands a daily surrender to the one who loved us and gave his life for us: "I live, no longer I, but Christ lives in me" (Gal 2:20) (Read, Unleash the Gospel, Marker 9.2, Grow. *https://www.unleashthegospel.org*). In a spirit of evangelization, disciples who center their lives in Christ give their God -given gifts of prayer, service, and generosity to their parish and their neighbors in need. When determining their weekly financial sacrificial offering to God, faithful stewards give back their "first fruits" to the Lord — not just what remains after their monthly expenses are paid. Remember, God's generosity is never outdone.
