Today we celebrate two people who are at the foundation of the See of Rome through their preaching, ministry, and martyrdom there in Rome. We celebrate Saints Peter and Paul.

Peter, named Simon, was a fisherman along with his brother Andrew. Jesus gave him the name of Cephas (Petrus in Latin), which mean "Rock." It was upon this rock that Jesus

chose to vibe the foundation of His Church. We perhaps easily identify with Peter. Out of fear, he denied Jesus at one point in his life but later professed his faith in Jesus. Despite his human weakness, and maybe because of his weakness, Jesus chose him to lead the Church after he departed from this earth. He was martyred in 64 AD and is buried in what we now call the Vatican, under the main altar in the basilica named after him.

Paul, is known as the Apostle of the Gentiles. Saul, his given name, was a Jewish pharisee who persecuted and killed christians. His conversion came as he was going to persecute more christians when he was knocked on his horse in a flash of light. He was baptized in the Lord and his sight was restored. He then preached Jesus Christ relentlessly until he was imprisoned in Rome, beheaded in 67 AD, and buried in Rome.

Though two powerful preachers and ministers, they were as one. Today we celebrate their relentless passion for spreading the faith. May they both continue to guide the Church, assisting all ministers to live and spread the Good News of Jesus, ** Today Archbishop Weisenburger will receive the pallium from Pope Leo at St. Peter's Basilica. This is the day when those appointed archbishops around the world, since June 29, 2024, receive this additional liturgical "garment." It is a relatively simple 2 inch wide white woolen "collar" or band, with two longer pendants in the front and behind. The Pope receives one during his installation or inauguration of his ministry,. Archbishops, having jurisdiction in an archdiocese with smaller or suffragan dioceses also generally placed in his oversight. (The Archbishop of Detroit is the Metropolitan bishop for the dioceses of Michigan, i.e., Detroit, Lansing, Kalamazoo, Grand Rapids, Saginaw, Gaylord, and Marquette.). The pallium is a visible sing of the bishop's communion with the Holy Father. Please pray for Archbishop Weisenburger as he receives his pallium this day, closely uniting us with the Holy Father as well. ** This Friday we celebrate Independence Day. We know there are many great things about our country that fill us with gratitude. We also now we still need to pray for peace across our land, and the world.

Our celebrations are done in the hope that one day all will be free, that one day the earth itself will shine with liberty.





Catholic Bible


The Bible used by the Catholic Church includes a few books that some other Christians do not consider equally sacred. The formation of the Bible took many centuries, and there is still not complete agreement over which books belong between its covers.

The Old Testament evolved from ancient books written mostly in Hebrew. By the third century bc, these were being translated into Greek along with a few books not so widely regarded as Sacred Scripture. The collection was called the *Septuagint*, and it was favored by many early Christians who knew Greek. In the fourth century ad, St. Jerome learned enough Hebrew to translate the Old Testament into Latin, and that collection has been called the *Vulgate*. Jerome omitted some questionable books from the Septuagint. Still, there were disputes about what belonged in a Bible.

In the sixteenth century, Martin Luther placed a number of the disputed books of the Bible in a separate section called *Apocrypha*. Luther and the Reformers questioned the status of some New Testament books also, but today's Christian Churches generally agree on the same twenty-seven of them.

The Catholic Bible includes some Old Testament books not found in other Bibles, such as Judith, Tobit, and 1 and 2 Maccabees. Verses from some of these offended the opinions of Protestant Reformers. Catholics used 2 Maccabees 12:43–45 to defend the teaching on purgatory and Tobit 12:9 to exhort the merits of good works. Excerpts from these books may show up, for example, at a Catholic funeral or wedding, when Christians from other churches may be present. The differences in these few books should not obscure the realization that Catholics have substantial agreement with other Christians about the content and importance of the Bible.


