ANOINTING OF THE SICK/ MINISTRY TO THE SICK

The Church strongly encourages people to receive the Sacrament (Anointing) of the Sick at the early stages of serious sickness or before serious surgeries.

In emergency situations needing the prompt attention of a priest, please call the parish office.

MARRIAGE

Must be a registered member, in good standing, of OLSOS.

Archdiocesan law requires advance notice of at least six months.

PARISH REGISTRATION

Newcomers to the parish may register in the Parish Office or online at OLSOS.org. Please notify the Parish Office of address changes.

Adults over 21 need to be registered as an individual member to be considered a Catholic in Good Standing.

While Msgr. Gary is away, he has asked that we share a few reflections from our Liturgical Life of the Parish booklet.

This week, we focus on The Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick — a beautiful expression of God's healing grace and

Last Rites

comfort in times of illness or difficulty.

If you've witnessed the Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick lately, you know anointing isn't what it used to be. In days before Vatican II, if the priest arrived for the anointing, or "extreme unction," or "last rites," you knew your hours were numbered.

Today the sacrament is no longer reserved for the dying. In fact, one could theologically make a case that the dying should not be anointed at all, but they should celebrate Viaticum. You can have "last rites" without a priest.

The rite of anointing is part of a book called Pastoral Care of the Sick: Rites of Anointing and Viaticum. Extreme unction means, "last anointing," and that term has been discontinued in favor of a broader term—the Pastoral Care of the Sick.

The document says:

Great care and concern should be taken to see that those of the faithful whose health is seriously impaired by sickness or old age receive this sacrament.... The sacrament may be repeated if the sick person recovers after being anointed and then again falls ill or if during the same illness the person's condition becomes more serious. A sick person may be anointed before surgery whenever a serious illness is the reason for the surgery. Elderly people may be anointed if they have become notably weakened even though no serious illness is present (8–10).

In short, anointing prays for recovery; it helps the "sick person . . . to bear suffering bravely . . . [and] fight against

it" (6). While a return to physical health may follow anointing, the grace received in the celebration provides spiritual strength, hope, and healing. If you're gravely sick, the time has come to anoint. If you're in the final moments before

death, however, we have a separate ritual called Commendation of the Dying. These prayers are used after the minister has already celebrated the Continuous Rite of Penance, Anointing, and Viaticum. It does not include the Anointing of the Sick. However, the rites for the dying should include another sacrament—Holy Communion given as Viaticum, or "food for the journey." The sacrament of the dying is "last communion," and it may be offered by any Communion minister.

After someone dies, we offer Prayers for the Dead. Again, they do not include an anointing. Among the requirements to celebrate the sacraments in the Catholic Church is to be a living, breathing, human being. After you've died, you don't need sacraments any more—you've got the real thing.

At your parish church, you probably only witness the Anointing of the Sick and not the rites for the dying—since pastoral care of the dying is generally offered in hospitals and homes. You might call the Commendation of the Dying the "last rites," and a priest need not be present for them because a family member or lay minister may lead these prayers. A priest is required if there is time to celebrate Penance and Anointing, if not already celebrated earlier in the illness. The Church gladly offers its pastoral care as freely as it can.

Stewardship Thoughts

Sixteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

The important theme of hospitality connects today's Scripture readings. In the Book of Genesis, Abraham's kindhearted hospitality to three unknown visitors results in Sarah and him being granted a son in their old age. Nothing is impossible with God. In St. Luke's Gospel, the evangelist narrates Martha's welcoming of Jesus to their home; she, though, complains to Him when her sister, Mary, decides to listen to His teaching rather than help Martha serve the meal. Martha does not realize that Mary is extending hospitality to Jesus through her attentiveness. Hospitality is an important pillar of the threefold aspect of Hymns, Homily, and Hospitality promoted at the parish. The stewardship act of greeters welcoming those who enter the church before Mass expresses warmth and hospitality toward newcomers and parishioners alike. Begin the evangelization process of unleashing the Gospel in your parish through hospitality.






