While Msgr. Gary is away, he has asked that we share a few reflections from our *Liturgical* Life of the Parish booklet.

#### This week, we focus on Scripture for Funerals.

The funeral liturgy has a remarkable power to help mourners along the path of grief. Our own words often fail to convey our sorrow, but the texts and actions of the liturgy bring assurance that others have felt these emotions before. We receive in turn the hope they have found.


The readings from sacred Scripture that accompany a funeral offer great solace. Everything we believe about eternal life comes first from the Bible. When we hear these texts next to the remains of one we loved, they soften our loss. The Scriptures for a funeral follow the same structure as any other Mass. Three readings may be chosen. The first is usually from the Old Testament. During the Easter season though, it is traditional for the first reading to come from Acts of the Apostles or Revelation. The second reading comes from the New Testament. The third proclaims a passage from one of the Gospels (traditionally from John during the Easter season). A funeral may have just two readings; a Gospel should always be included.

Normally a funeral does not take place on a solemnity or Sunday. It may, but on solemnities and the Sundays of Advent, Lent, and Easter, the readings for those days prevail. The funeral liturgy offers a collection of passages some for the death of an adult, others for a child. A parish may invite members of the deceased's family to make the selections. They may find

texts that remind them of traits of the one they've lost, favorite passages that bring consolation, or forgotten words that shed new light when it is most needed. Some texts fit an unexpected death. Others acknowledge the bleak sadness that threatens to cloud our hope.

If more than three passages seem appropriate, others may be proclaimed at the vigil service or even the place of committal. The Order of Christian Funerals, available at any Catholic church, contains the complete selection.

The theme of perseverance in prayer connects today's Scripture readings. In the Book of Genesis, Abraham persists in n prayer by negotiating with God to shield the innocent from His destruction of Sodom and Gomorrah. In his Gospel, the evangelist St. Luke retells Jesus' teaching of the Lord's Prayer to His followers. Christ, too, tells the parable of the man who visits a friend at midnight to request food and, through his determination, is successful in his efforts. Making quiet time for daily prayer is essential, but discerning God's response to prayer is also vital to strengthening our personal relationship, our discipleship in our Lord and Savior. Set aside a few minutes each day for a conversation with Jesus.


