Stewardship Thoughts

Twenty-Sixth Sunday in Ordinary Time In today's First Reading from the Book of the Prophet Amos, he warns the complacent in Zion against extravagant living with no concern for their needy neighbors. In St. Luke's Gospel, the evangelist narrates Jesus' telling the parable of Lazarus and the rich man to the Pharisees. The rich man — so preoccupied with his own riches and luxury — disregards the beggar Lazarus at his door. In eternal life, Lazarus is carried away by angels to the bosom of Abraham while the rich man has condemned himself to eternal torment. This is not due to his wealth, but because he ignored the needs of his poor neighbor, Lazarus. Jesus commands love of neighbor as the second of the great commandments. Christian stewards embrace this directive when they generously share their abundant gifts with those who are less fortunate. Donate time at a local soup kitchen as a way to exhibit your love of neighbor.






