## Half and Half from Msgr. Gary Smetanka

The month of October is traditionally Respect Life Month, set aside for reflection by the US bishops. Here is a part of the statement from Bishop Daniel Thomas, Bishop of Toledo, OH, chair of the USCCB Committee on Pro-life activities.

*With great joy we celebrate October as Respect Life Month amid the Church's Jubilee Year of Hope. This Jubilee Year "offers us the opportunity to appreciate anew, and with immense gratitude, the gift of the new life that we have received in Baptism, a life capable of transfiguring death's drama."*<sup>1</sup> *The life, death, and resurrection of our Lord Jesus Christ is the foundation of our hope. Through Christ, our sins are forgiven, death is overcome, and life is victorious.*

*Yet, the daily headlines remind us of how desperately our world is thirsting for the hope that only God can provide. Every day we witness the overwhelming disregard for human life: through rising rates of abortion and assisted suicide; the killing of innocent school children, even at prayer; the mistreatment of our immigrant sisters and brothers as they endure an environment of aggression; and political and ideological violence inflicted against unsuspecting victims. These attacks threaten life precisely when it is most vulnerable and in need of protection.*

*Despite these realities, the gift of human life exists as a sign of hope to our world today, defying the powers of darkness and the culture of death. It is of the utmost importance that we work to ensure that every life, in every stage and circumstance, is protected in law.*

*...As we begin Respect Life Month, together we embrace the words of Pope Leo XIV, "How important it is that each and every baptized person feel himself or herself called by God to be a sign of hope in the world today."*<sup>2</sup> *Each of us is called to be a witness to the Gospel of Life, proclaiming in word and deed the innate goodness and dignity of every human person.*

\*\* Each October, across the archdiocese (and I think the country), head counts are taken at Sunday Masses. This data is then used to help make decisions in the parish regarding Mass times, if they still need the amount of Masses they have based upon the "occupancy" rate of those at Mass vs what the church holds. The guideline is each Mass should be filled with at least half of the total capacity. Here at Star, our seating capacity in the pews (not the additional chairs) is 550. (The collected data is also used by the diocese in its pastoral planning.) So please be extra diligent coming as a family to Mass, especially your preferred Mass time!

### Stewardship Thoughts

**Twenty-Seventh Sunday in Ordinary Time** The topic of faith connects today's Scripture passages. In both the First Reading from the Book of the Prophet Habakkuk and St. Paul's Second Letter to Timothy, the sacred writers proclaim that faith and patience are necessary to withstand hardships and struggles. Arrested for professing faith in Christ to the people, St. Paul writes this Second Letter to Timothy from prison. In St. Luke's Gospel, Jesus declares to his Apostles that belief the size of a mustard seed can uproot a mulberry tree and plant it in the sea. In other words, just a minute amount of faith is very powerful. Being a disciple of the Lord demands both faith and trust. Faith is God's gift to us. How do we, as Christian stewards, increase faith and trust in our Lord and Savior? Begin each day with a few minutes of prayer and include some verses of Scripture reading. Participate in sacramental Confession regularly. At Mass, partake in the Eucharistic mystery where Jesus becomes truly present — Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity — in the consecrated Bread and Wine.

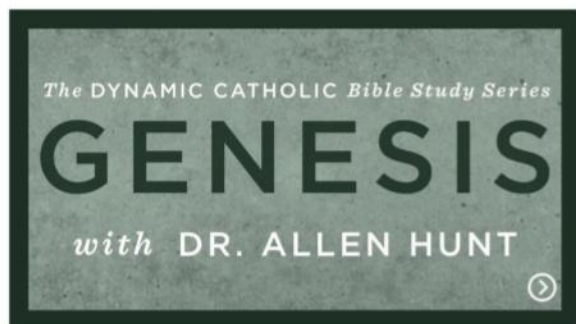

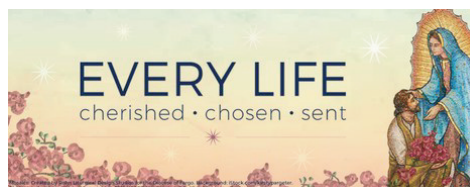
## Operation Christmas Child

In October, the Catholic Church in the US celebrates Respect Life Month and the first Sunday of October

is designated as Respect Life Sunday. To support this annual observance the USCCB offered this article on October 6, 2024.

The Church proclaims that each human life is sacred, and that every human person has dignity. Human dignity is not conditioned on anything other than the fact that each human person was brought into existence. It applies to each person, regardless of his or her abilities, condition, race, age, or any other factor. It cannot be earned or taken away.

This inherent dignity means that each person's life is worthy of protection, and that every person has a fundamental right to life. Since the earliest days of Christianity, the Church has clearly and consistently spoken against the taking of innocent life.

A person's right to live begins at the very beginning of his or her existence, which is at conception, and extends to natural death. That human life begins at conception—which is not merely a religious belief, but a scientific and biological fact—has important implications for when human life should be protected.

In recognition of the sanctity of human life, the Church opposes abortion, which is the intentional killing of a child in the womb. Not only is abortion the direct taking of innocent life—[Pope Francis has spoken of abortion as murder](#)—but it also impacts the most vulnerable and voiceless member of the human family: The preborn child. The U.S. bishops have identified abortion as their preeminent priority in this country not only because of its impact on the most vulnerable, but also because of its scope: Abortion has claimed the lives of some 65 million children in the half century that *Roe v. Wade* was in effect, [including 1.5 million in Michigan alone](#).
