## Half and Half from Msgr. Gary Smetanka

On this Second Sunday of Easter, also known as Divine Mercy Sunday. It was Saint Pope John Paul II that assigned the title "Divine Mercy Sunday" to the Second Sunday of Easter. He personally knew Saint Faustina, the religious sister in Poland to whom Our Lord appeared under the title of Divine Mercy. Saint John Paul II shared in the special devotion of St. Faustina and was the one who

helped promote her canonization. How amazing and appropriate that he died the evening before the liturgical celebration of Divine Mercy Sunday in 2005.

The image of Divine Mercy, i.e., a depiction of Christ with red and white rays emanating from his heart, is on display by our Easter cross however you usually find it the rest of the year by our confessional. .

Jesus wants us to know of his great mercy but we need to place our trust in him. Today we need to know of Christ's mercy more than ever. We see many divisions, conflicts, with so many people searching for peace in life. We need to know that it is in Jesus that we find shelter and refuge. Especially in the Sacrament of Reconciliation, we find an abundance of Christ's mercy freely given for us. Our Holy Fathers so often talk about our need to open up our hearts to receive the Lord's mercy and to share it with others!

Thanks to the "Good Friday" crew who comes in that evening and transforms the church ready for the Easter celebrations. 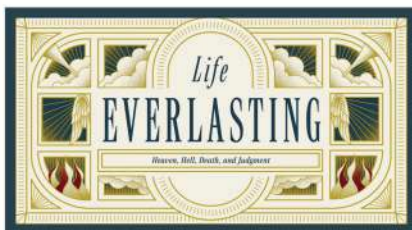

## Archdiocesan Restructuring



The Archdiocese of Detroit began a season of intentional renewal in November 2025 through a two-year journey of discernment and planning. This March, we enter **Phase 2: Listening and Refinement**. More than 400 Listening Sessions will take place across the Archdiocese of Detroit offering parishioners the chance to review draft models, share feedback, and help shape the future of their parish and Planning Area. Your voice and prayerful input are essential to this process. Beginning in July 2027, different groups of parishes will form pastorates led by a single pastor and his team. While some communities may merge or buildings may change in purpose, no decisions have been made in advance; outcomes will be shaped by the collective wisdom of the faithful. You are invited to participate, listen, and journey with us as we discern a mission-focused future for our Church in Detroit.

### Phase 1: Kickoff and Discernment

AUGUST 2025 TO MARCH 2026

- Parish, curia, and ministry data collected and analyzed
- Consultation and feedback with priests, deacons, and parish leaders
- Restructuring initiative announced to the public (Nov. 17, 2025)
- Criteria developed for pastorate models
- Parishes grouped into “planning areas” to begin discernment
- Priests meet to develop draft pastorate models (January 2026)



**Pastorate Discernment Modeling Sessions (Jan 14-16)**  
*170+ priests gathered for three days to pray, discuss, and discern new models for the structure of our parishes.*

### Phase 2: Listening and Refinement

APRIL 2026 TO DECEMBER 2026

- Parish workbooks (data & demographics) posted on restructuring website
- **Each parish holds two listening sessions open to public (Spring 2026)**
- Curia holds listening session
- Priest assignment process discernment begins
- Pastorate models refined and presented for Archbishop Weisenburger’s consideration

## How Can I Get Involved?

First and foremost, join us in prayer. You can view the Prayer for Archdiocesan Restructuring on our website. You can also sign up to receive specific prayer intentions each month, so you can include them in your personal prayer, or as part of your parish's intercessory prayer team. During spring of 2026, all Catholics in the Archdiocese of Detroit will have the opportunity to share their feedback on various drafts models. Each model proposes a different option for grouping parishes together into pastorates. Each Parish will host two listening sessions at which you can learn more about the plans and share your feedback. Within a few weeks of your Listening Session, every parishioner will be provided and opportunity to share additional feedback in an online survey. Every piece of feedback will be discerned and considered as valuable contribution to this process.

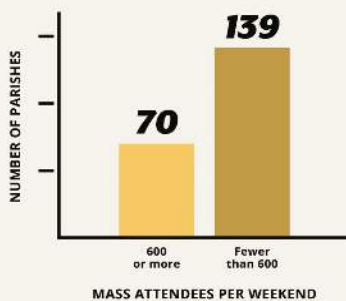
## When Are My Local Parish Listening Sessions?

## Why Does the Archdiocese of Detroit Need to Restructure?

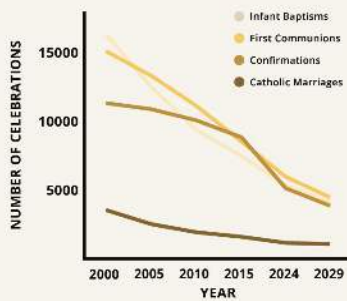
**THIS INITIATIVE IS ROOTED IN OUR MISSION TO BRING CHRIST MORE FULLY INTO THE LIVES OF THE FAITHFUL AND TO STRENGTHEN SPIRITUAL AND COMMUNAL BONDS ACROSS OUR ARCHDIOCESE.**

Over recent decades, we've seen significant shifts: fewer Catholics attending Mass, declining participation in the sacraments, and an ever-shrinking number of priests due to aging and retirement. Once serving 1.5 million Catholics, we now minister to approximately 900,000 – with fewer than half attending Mass regularly. At the same time, we've struggled to maintain buildings, structures, and ministries designed for a much larger Church, and that's left us stretched thin – making it harder to fully serve where people need us most.



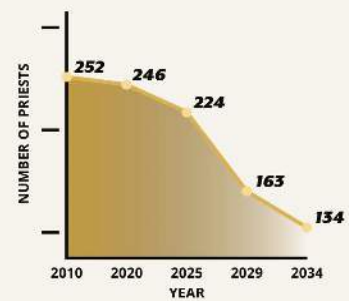
### Mass Attendance

Today, 67% of parishes have fewer than 600 weekly Mass attendees. In the next five years, more than three-quarters of parishes are projected to shrink.



### Sacraments

In the past 25 years, we've seen a dramatic decline in Baptisms, First Communions and Confirmations, and a steady decline in marriages.



### Fewer Priests

Most active priests are 50 and older, and the total number of priests is projected to decline by 40% in the next 10 years.
