The Flood	- Waters of the flood	- Waters of baptism
Creation Story, Adam and Eve	- Adam - disobedience - temptation - death - Garden of Eden - Tree of Knowledge of Good and Evil - Spirit moving over the face of the waters	- Christ - obedience - - - - -
The Sign of Jonah	- Jonah - 3 days in the belly of fish/Sheoul - Ninevah - Gentile city - repents of their sins	- - - - -
Eliakim	- Eliakim - Successors of kinship - Office over the kingdom but below King David - Father to the kingdom	- Peter - Successors of appointment - -

Traits of Typology:

- Parallels: A shared sameness or continuity
- Inversions: A parallel that is reversed or redeemed or made whole
- Convergence: Different parallels and types converge to the same antitype
- Greater: The Antitype is greater than the Type
