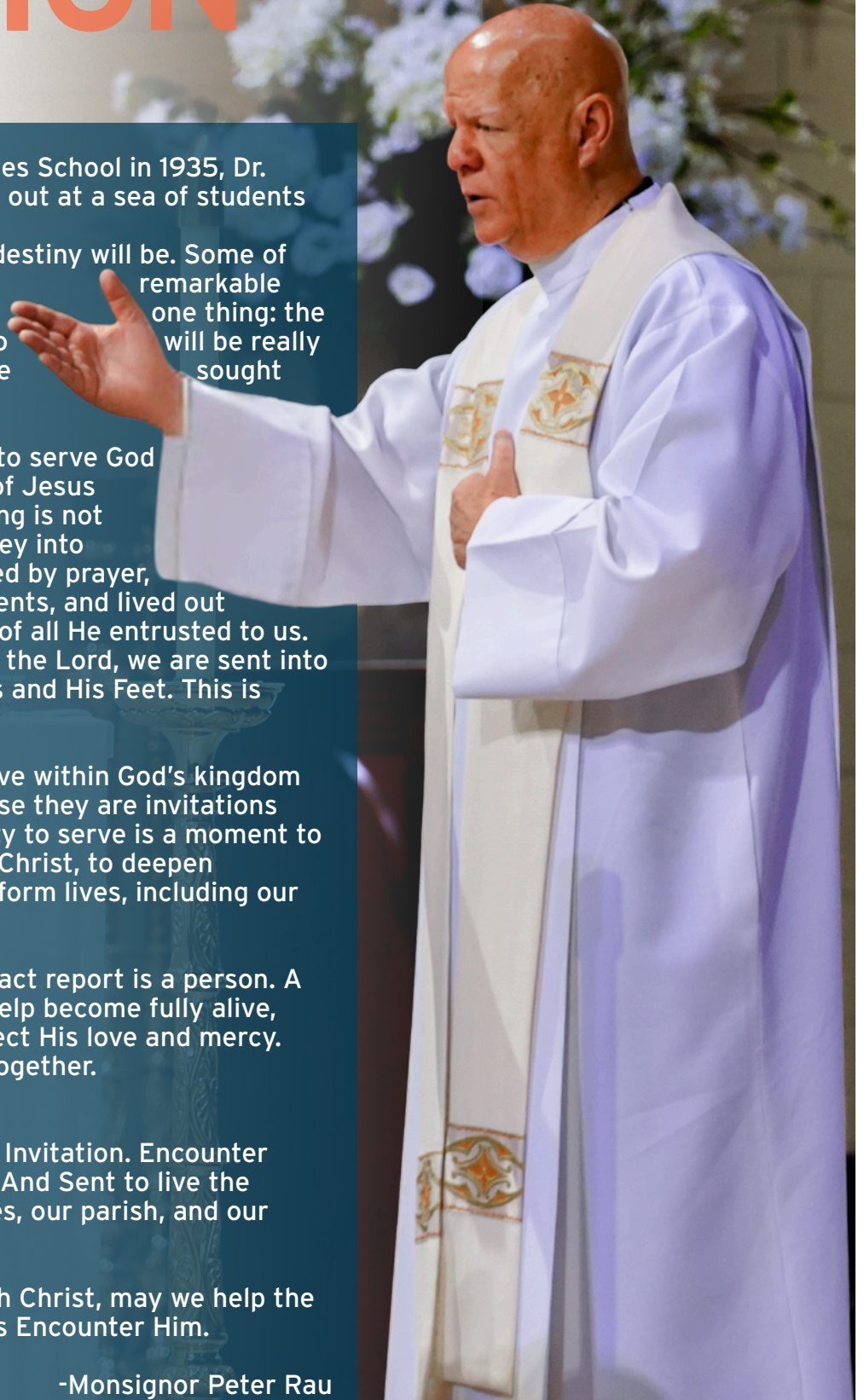

ENCOUNTER THE GOD

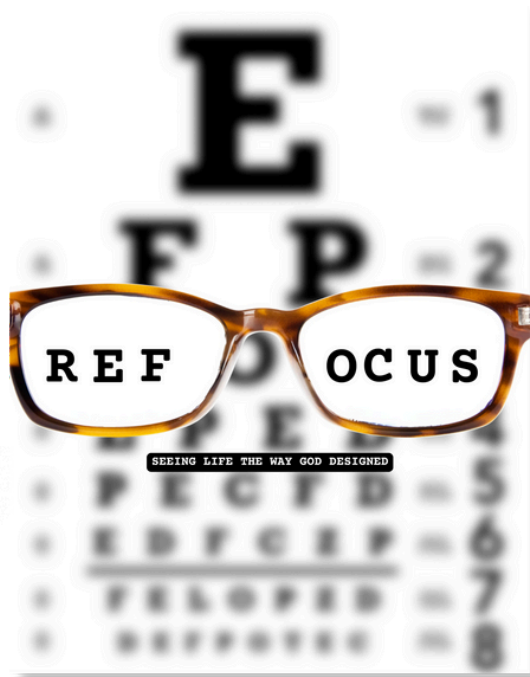

REFOCUS

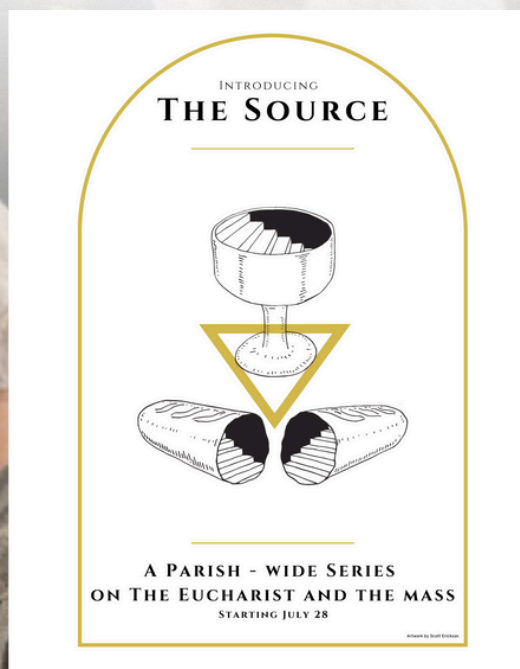
Seeing life the way God designed calls us to cherish every person—from the smallest child in the womb to the wisdom-filled members of our senior community, and everyone in between.

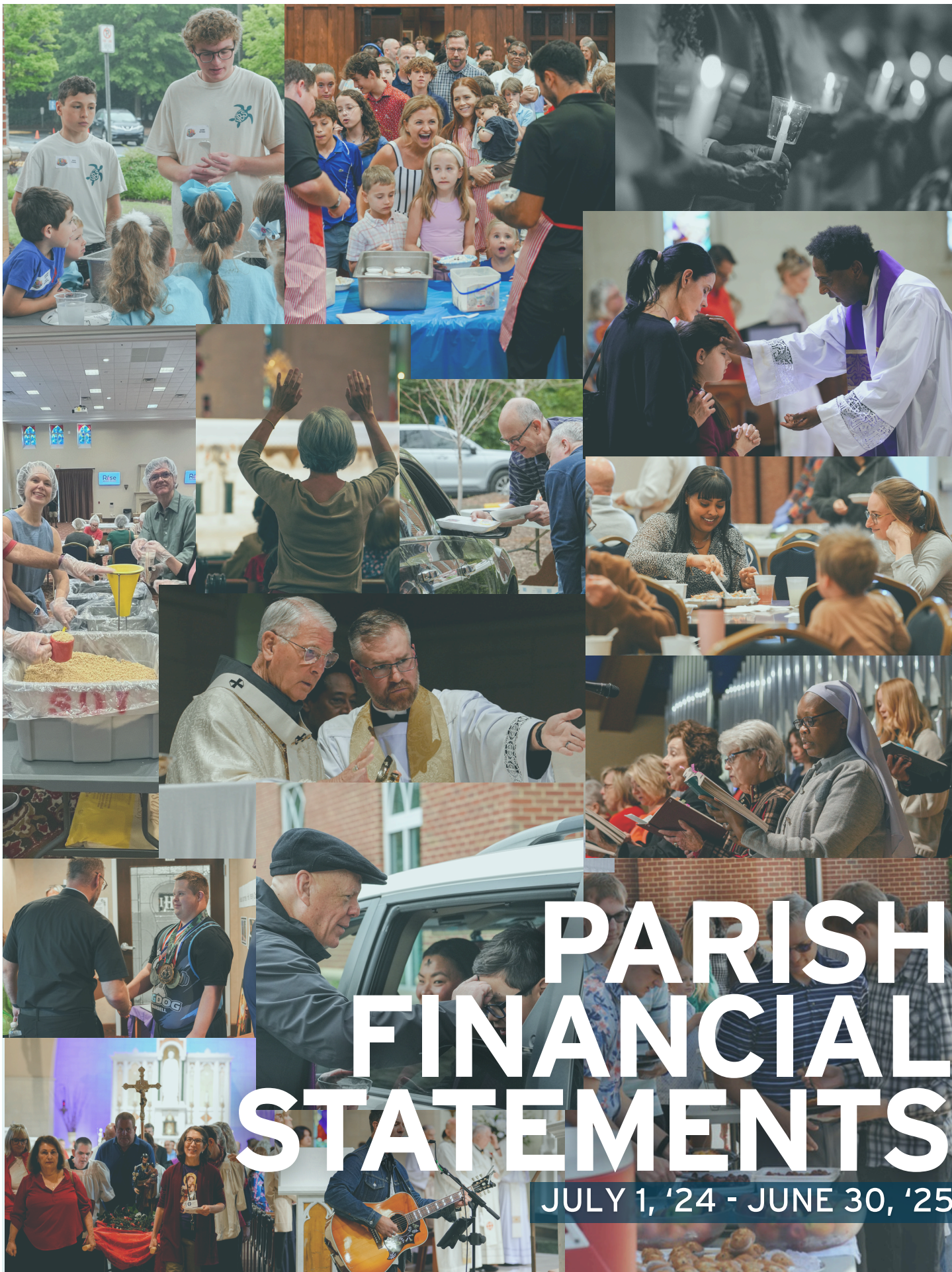
THE SOURCE

Last July, our parish was transformed through The Source, a powerful sermon series diving deep into John 6, where Jesus declares Himself the Bread of Life. Week after week, His words came alive, inviting us to encounter Christ's real presence in the Eucharist—the Source and Summit of our faith.

That encounter didn't stay within our walls. We gathered for a Night of Healing, where hearts were restored and faith renewed. Then, moved by Christ's love, we turned outward—packing over 30,000 meals with Rise Against Hunger. Each pack, enough to feed a family of six, became a tangible sign of God's mercy flowing through us to the world.

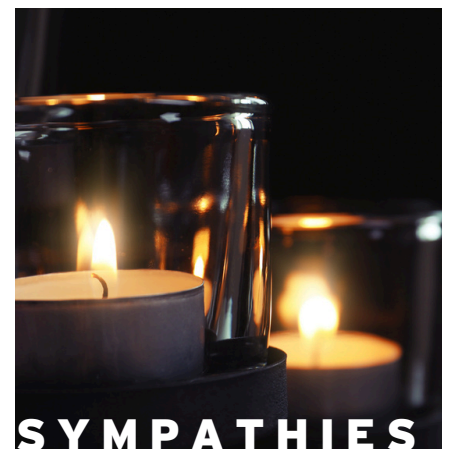
