A MESSAGE FROM FR. STEVE

Feast of the Presentation of the Lord

This year, since February 2 falls on a Sunday, the Feast of the Presentation of the Lord takes precedence over the 4th Sunday of Ordinary Time. This Feast is the 40th day since Christmas, and is when we recall Mary and Joseph coming to Jerusalem to present Jesus after the Mary's ritual purification were completed. It was a day of profound joy for Mary and Joseph, as well as both Anna and Simeon, two faithful Israelites who were awaiting the coming of the Messiah. Today, we call to mind the beautiful light that Christ represents, especially as He came to Jerusalem. This day is often called "Candlemas," because candles are blessed for use in church and in homes. It has traditionally included a procession with candles to remind us of the great privilege we have to be bearers of the Light of Christ. May we welcome Jesus, and recall the profound privilege of being, in Christ, "Lights for the World."

Catholicism 101

Beginning today, Brian Fink, our Middle School Religion & History teacher and a member of the parish formation team, will be offering a weekly course entitled "Catholicism 101: Introduction to Catholic Thought & Theology." The course is designed to introduce (or re-introduce) participants to the foundational principles, major content, doctrinal truths, and rich beauty of Catholic teaching. The course will occur weekly, between the 9am and 11am Sunday masses in Mercy Hall. We will gather in the cafeteria while Coffee & Donuts is going on.

Sunday of the Word of God

Last week, I preached about the importance of taking time daily reading and meditating on the Sacred Scriptures. At the 11:00 a.m. and 5:00 p.m. Masses, I referenced a study conducted by the Center for Biblical Engagement. They found that people who "engage" the Bible four or more times per week are:

- 228% more likely to share the faith with others
- 407% more likely to memorize scripture verses
- 59% less likely to view pornography
- 30% less likely to struggle with loneliness

That's a pretty good list of "benefits," not to mention St. Jerome's dictum: "Ignorance of Scripture is ignorance of Christ." May we be among those who daily let the water of the word wash over us, and may He who Is the Word help us understand and obey the Word.

Reading Through The Bible (and Catechism) in a Year is something that I'm planning to do, and I invite you to prayerfully consider doing so yourselves. If not this weekend, definitely by next weekend, I will have cards that lay out the Scriptures and Catechism readings that would allow you to read through both documents in a year. If that seems too ambitious, perhaps think about reading through it in two years. In any case, you'll be better off by spending time in the Scriptures and the Catechism. I have also provided a few links to resources for reading the Bible in a year and other biblical resources on our website.

"Fight of Flight?" Discussion February 15

Last October, along with other members of the parish, I attended the Touchstone Magazine Conference entitled, "Fight of Flight? The Benedict & Other Options for Facing the World, the Flesh, and the Devil." It was a great conference. The videos of the conference are available online (touchstonemag.com). Two of the talks, those given by Ross Douthat and Rod Dreher, are available to everyone. All the other talks, as well as talks from prior conferences, are available online to those who subscribe to Touchstone Magazine, which, by the way, I recommend very strongly. Given the importance of the questions that the conference raised, and our commitment to helping members of the parish and community face the challenges of living out the faith, we have decided to get together "Lumen style," i.e., with appetizers and beverages, to watch a video of the first night's conversation between Ross Douthat, Tony Esolen, and Rod Dreher. After the video, we will then have a collective conversation about the video, facilitated by John Yocum, who was one of the presenters at the Touchstone Conference. We plan to gather together in Mercy Hall on February 15 at 7:00 p.m., watch the video, and engage with the ideas they discussed collectively. It should be a great evening of fellowship and engagement with ideas as we all strive to discover the best ways to hold onto and live the faith in our times.

Come Encounter Jesus

Next Saturday, February 8th, we will have our next Healing Encounter. It is a time of praise, worship, prayer, and adoration from 7:00 to 9:00 p.m. in the church. It's a great opportunity to worship God and to open our hearts to have Him do healing work in us. Come, and bring others with you. Prayer teams will be available to pray for healing and other requests. Come, and invite someone to join you.

Last week all across the country, we celebrated National Catholic Schools Week. We recognized the opportunity we have in this great country to freely worship God and to teach our children how to live in this world as Disciples of Christ. Quite often it is a freedom and privilege we take for granted, but the responsibility of handing down our faith is something we should never take lightly.

St. John Paul II says, *"to educate in the truth, and for genuine freedom and evangelical love, is at the very heart of the Church's mission. In a cultural climate in which moral norms are often thought to be matters of personal preference, Catholic schools have a crucial role to play in leading the younger generation to realize that freedom consists above all in being able to respond to the demands of the truth..."*

This has been the apostolate of our school since 1926, and we are grateful to our parishioners and Fr. Steve for generously providing for the needs of our school. This includes both the material and spiritual gifts need for us to bring Christ to our students and families. We are eternally grateful for the parishioners who continually fast and pray for the parish and school. God only knows how much good has been accomplished through the grace of these spiritual gifts. We are truly blessed to be surround by such a strong community of faith.

Now Enrolling for 2020-2021:

We are now enrolling for next year, and our early estimates show that we could see 4 - 5 classrooms at a waitlist next year. This puts us in a rare category of being one of only a few schools in the diocese showing growth.

Our increases in enrollment may result in us opening up a second classroom in multiple grades and hiring an additional teacher or two. Therefore, it would really help us plan for next year, if we were able meet with those prospective families in February and March.

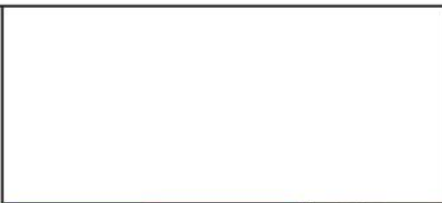
